Experience with Children

Minimum 100 documented

hours of formal volunteer experience with children, preferably in a child life setting



Academic Performance

Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with a **recommended GPA of at least 3.0** in the final 60 hours of undergraduate coursework



Relevant Coursework

Infant, child, and adolescent development; child and family issues; childhood medical conditions; health communication; play; developmental psychology; child life theory



Interest & Passion for Child Life

This should be reflected in the candidate's personal statement
